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### **CROSS TRAIL PHASE 6 MATCH FUNDRAISING DRIVE**

With your support, Sitka Trail Works can finish building the Sitka Cross Trail, a 40-year community goal! Help **Make the Match** so the project is built in 2019! We need your donation to construct the last 2.6 miles and **Cross the Finish Line**!



Do you use the Cross Sitka Trail Works (STW), in partnership with City and **Forest** the Service, has been working on the final segment, Phase 6, with design and permitting nearly complete. We are: Ready, Set, Go for Construction 2019. But STW needs your help to Cross the Finish Line! A \$1,811,000 Federal Lands Access construction grant for final phase 6 is secured BUT must raise we \$20,000 as the local portion of the match before the last 2.6 miles are built; No Match, No Project.

**Background:** The Cross Trail is a long-standing community priority and has been a goal in seven major Sitka plans since 1975. Since 2006, over \$2,485,716 (99% grant, donations or in-kind) has been raised to construct and reconstruct over five miles of first five phases of the Cross Trail. Additionally, over 5.7 miles of multiuse, separated pathways along Indian River Rd. and Sawmill Creek Rd. were added during road upgrade projects since 2004. The separated paths, in combination with the Cross Trail, form a multiuse pathway system that is nearly 11 miles long.

Phase 6 of the Cross Trail, the final section, will extend the trail from Harbor Mountain Road to the Old Sitka boat launch, Sitka Rocks cruise ship dock and facilities and trails at Starrigavan Recreation Area. When Phase 6 is complete, multiuse, separated bike and walking paths will run along the entire length of the Sitka road system. The trail is designed to have negligible maintenance needs, withstand high water flows and is in an area that hasn't been identified as a landslide zone. STW will continue to access grant funds for our on-going maintenance program for local trails.



**Current Status:** By donating to the Cross Trail, you will build the trail and will support making our community more livable by creating more opportunities for healthy activity for families, kids and people of all fitness needs. Trails are good for business, too, they attract a talented workforce and visitors and help sustain a healthy economy.

## **Indian River Trail - Major Maintenance Project Summer 2018**

Sitka Trail Works worked with the Forest Service this past winter on efforts to secure funding major maintenance of the Indian River Trail using Title II Secure Rural Schools RAC funds. With RAC funds in hand, the Forest Service is coordinating the work and permitting. Juneau Trail Mix crew has been hired to work for 3 weeks beginning June 18. Their work will be limited to repairs over the first 1.5 miles of trail. Their first priority will be addressing safety hazards.

The Sitka Ranger District trail crew will begin work at the same time and spend 4-5 weeks working on the trail. Their focus will be rerouting the trail at the last Indian River crossing. The reroute is about 1500 feet in length and will require two new log stringer bridges. There is no bridge at the location of the existing crossing and it can be tricky to cross the river unless flows are very low. Prior to June 18, the Forest Service will be using a helicopter to fly in gravel and lumber to several locations along the trail. Total project cost is

approximately \$60,000. The Forest Service has a permit which allows them to

remove gravel from alluvial deposits near the last crossing. They will be looking for volunteers to fill bags of this gravel for use on the reroute. They will need volunteers fill 50 bags: "DIG, DUMP, REPEAT!" in May or early June. Stay tuned to the STW Facebook page for information closer to the date.
