

Bill Foster and Bob Miller with their bikes in Cuba in the summer of 1959


Dear Sitka Trail Works Supporters,

#### **Cross Trail Project Status**

With all the funding and permitting in place since November 2018, Sitka Trail Works scheduled work to begin on February 15. Startup has had several delays. The first was in early spring 2019 when the City proposed a trail reroute through the Granite Creek quarry. With the help of our members, on April 23, 2019, the Assembly voted to build the trail on STW's currently funded and permitted alignment.



Thank you to Troy Bayne, STW Trail Foreman, for his continued agreement support and dedication to completing the Cross Trail!

Currently, we are waiting for a contract or agreement with the City to be finalized so work can begin. The Director has been working through several iterations of a contract with the City. With federal project grants many regulations apply as to how the project funds are expended and CBS wants to be sure that they comply with federal grant and labor law requirements. Many of these rules have become more strict since the last Phase 4/5 project was completed.

Slowly we have synthesized an agreement which more closely resembles how the work will be accomplished by the nonprofit versus the lengthy commercial construction

contract first proposed by CBS. A full commercial contract stands to increase the budget significantly so working with the City to simplify it is key. STW is not a commercial contractor and doesn't have the staff capacity or budget of a for profit business. Instead STW is facilitating the completion of a community goal for community benefit in a cost efficient, not-for-profit manner. The fact that the nonprofit STW initiated the project, applied for the construction grant through CBS, managed and completed all planning, permitting and construction documents, and raised 94% of the match (6% funded by CBS) also requires a non-standard agreement.

An agreement proposed by STW is being reviewed by CBS consultants to make sure it meets federal procurement regulations. We are hopeful this agreement will provide CBS with necessary assurances that federal grant requirements are being met. If it's not approved and a more expensive standard construction contract is necessary, STW may have to build less trail.

Troy Bayne, our foreman for the project and trail constructor extraordinaire, has been very patiently waiting to start work as the summer season has slipped by. He deserves a lot of recognition for his dedication to and continued support of STW. We could not get this project done without his selfless help. We all appreciate Troy's tremendous assistance and patience! We still hope to get 'er done, by 2021!
