

## 2023 Trail Planning Begins

Building off the success of the last twenty years, it's time for a new vision for our trail system. For over two decades, Sitka Trail Works has maintained and improved our local trail network in partnership with the City of Sitka, State Parks, the US Forest Service, Sitka Tribe of Alaska, and the National Park Service. Many of the outdoor destinations we cherish today exist because Sitkans identified them as priorities in the 2003 Sitka Trail Plan.

Having accomplished many of the original objectives, Sitka Trail Works is excited to launch a new community-wide Trail Planning process. Collectively agreeing on our next priorities and advancing projects to shovel ready status will help Sitka compete for state and federal infrastructure funding. With this new plan guiding the way, we envision an even more robust trail system that supports the physical, mental, spiritual, and cultural vibrancy for future generations.

## Sitka Trail Survey seeks your input

All Sitkans are invited to be a part of shaping the future of our trails. To start, Sitka Trail Works is widely distributing a public survey to gather information about current uses, challenges, and opportunities for our trail system. Everyone who completes the survey will be entered into a drawing to win a \$100 cash prize. The survey is available online or in print at the library and will be open through the end of May.



After an initial round of extensive public engagement, Sitka Trail Works and partners will assess trail concept feasibility, identify shared priorities, and assemble an initial list of new trail project ideas. This draft list will be distributed to the public for another round of review and feedback. Only after a thorough vetting and approval by all public land managers will the new plan be formalized.

### Remembering Marge & Tedin

Late last year, Marge Ward and her partner Marlys Tedin left a generous legacy gift to Sitka Trail Works in their will. Marge and Tedin, who passed in 2019 and 2015, will be remembered as smart, resourceful Alaskan women who led remarkable lives over half a century in Sitka. Marge and Tedin worked as nurses at Mt. Edgecumbe Hospital and were dedicated to serving others. Active on the Alaska State Parks Advisory Board, their quiet leadership and advocacy resulted in improvements to Mosquito Cove and Forest & Muskeg Trails, Halibut Point Rec. Old Sitka Boat Launch and other beloved local facilities. Both invested significantly in local causes, bringing sharp wit, good humor, and mentorship. Thank you to Marge and Tedin, extraordinary woman who committed their lives to caring for Sitka and made this incredibly generous contribution as their last wish.

#### Cross Trail Update

Work is underway on the bridge over Chix'i Héen! Once No Name Creek is spanned, the trail will extend from Starrigavan to downtown! Completion of this route has been a dream of the community since the 1970's and was formalized in the landmark 2003 Trail Plan.

After the mainline is finished, we'll turn our attention to the Connector Trail that will link to 4800 block of Halibut Point Road, near the new Cruise Terminal. Additional funding will need to be secured to complete 0.3 miles of the 0.6 mile Connector.



The project is experiencing a budget shortfall due to increases in construction costs and unexpected terrain challenges. Per lineal foot, excavating the approach to No Name Creek cost three times the average and took four times as long to complete. To ensure we can complete the project, we've seeking new private and public funds. The Royal Caribbean Group has generously donated \$75,000, which will be used to leverage federal funding sources. We are projecting the latest completion date to be June 2023.
